There is a song that has a line in it that begins "If I can help somebody with a word or Song ...then my living would not be in vain" that totally fit this couple – Reverend Rufus and Mrs. Jestine Cochran. When asked what his favorite thing in the world was, he answered. "Even though I am now retired, I still love being a pastor and I love preaching. I still preach as often as possible". Although he confessed to being 80 years old, he also indicated that he loved talking to the 'elderly'. Then laughingly said that he recognized that he can probably be considered elderly himself, spoke at length about the wise counsel he has received from those older than him.
